JDC Central (JDCC) is a three day event that showcases academics, athletics, social spirit, and charity. Delegate compete in academic case competitions, parliamentary style debates, sports tournaments and social competitions. The event lets students showcase all aspects of university life from school spirit and dedication, to academic skills and teamwork. The team that performs the best overall takes home the prestigious "School of the Year" title. JDC Central is one of Canada's fastest growing business student competition. Every year, the event welcomes close to 700 competitors from 14 major business schools, making JDC Central one of the largest competitions around. JDCC boasts the most talented and well rounded students from across Central & Atlantic Canada and is a wonderful networking opportunity between current and future business leaders.

# **JDC Central History**

Following the tremendous success that Jeux du Commerce (JDC) has known in Quebec since its inception in 1989, the competition began its expansion to the rest of the country in 2005 with the inaugural edition of JDC West. After gaining enough support, JDC Central was born in 2010 and was hosted by Ryerson University's Ted Rogers School of Management in 2010. Since then, JDC Central has grown to welcome 14 Universities, all of them now sending full delegations to compete in 8 academic disciplines, sports, social and debate. JDCC has been hosted by such universities as: Wilfrid Laurier University, Carleton University's Sprott School of Business, Dalhousie University and Guelph University. JDC Central has invited hundreds of business students to compete annually in January, continuing a long legacy of academic integrity and competitive excellence, under the guardianship of the Canadian Association of Business Students.

# **JDC Central Programming**

JDC Central is built on 4 main pillars:

- 1. Academics
- 2. Social
- 3. Athletics
- 4. Debate

Academic cases pit teams of three students from each university against each other. Each team is given three hours to solve a business case and build a presentation of their recommendations. The teams have to solve the case with limited resources; One laptop, and no connection to the outside world. Industry experts act as judges to determine the feasibility and value of each team's proposal. Year after year, JDCC competitors show how global ready they are.

Social teams have to prepare for fun and outlandish events like: scavenger hunts, relay races, improvisation challenges or dance-offs. The social competitions test the students' abilities in ways that no academic test can. Teams of four students must prepare costumes and performances with very limited information, all in advance of the competition. They are on call at every hour during the competition and never know when, or where a challenge might start. Through these challenges students show their dedication, passion, wit and creativity in the most innovative ways.



Athletic competitions let students show their prowess in the sporting arena. Each university puts together a team of athletes that spend months preparing for two different sporting tournaments. During the competition they play in ladder style tournaments against other universities vying for the top spot. The sports they play can be traditional ones like football, or non-traditional ones like planet ball. Students show the true meaning of teamwork, and strategy through these tournaments

Debate illustrates the logic and reasoning of students in a parliamentary style debate. Teams of four students will be assigned debate topics as they enter the room, and will be forced to think on their feet. Teams must represent the side of the debate they are given and present their arguments in a strict format for a panel of judges. Students are able to challenge the arguments of their competing peers in what frequently becomes heated debates on the world's toughest current issues. Students show their knowledge on current issues and utilize their expert presentation skills to eloquently word their positions.
