OVERVIEW

CABS Roundtable is one of Canada's largest and most prestigious student-run conferences, and the keystone event in the CABS conference circuit. An annual affair, it connects over 250 of the brightest student leaders from over 25 of the top business schools across the country. Every year since its inception in 2008, CABS Roundtable has been hosted in a different Canadian city. The host university is selected by the CABS board of directors and is mandated to create and promote

a conference that highlights leadership, team building, and best practices to ensure the success of each school's individual business society. Additionally, each CABS Roundtable serves to host the CABS AGM, in which the elected management team and board of directors develop the strategy and objectives for the organization over the coming term. Each year, member schools place bids to host this reputable event, and it is held between the end of February and the beginning of March.

ACCOMODATIONS

HOTEL DETAILS

The Westin Calgary is situated in the heart of one of Canada's most exciting cities, where the major business centre meets the city's extraordinary outdoor activities and first-class dining and arts. Their 25 updated meeting rooms are 100% wind powered and offer over 26,000 square feet of Calgary meeting space for conferences and conventions.



Please be advised that your room may not be ready until 3PM on the day of arrival. Please check in at the RT registration table before heading to the hotel front desk.

Check out on Sunday, February 28th is 11AM. Organizing a late check out time will be the responsibility of the delegate.



The first delegate to check into the room will have to put down their credit card number. This will be to pre-authorize for incidentals. Any and all damage will be charged back to the individuals in the room.

Delegates that will be driving to and from the conference will have underground parking available to them. This parking comes at a cost of \$12 per day, and can be arranged with the front desk upon check-in. One ATM is available in the hotel lobby. Alternatively, there is a TD Bank across the street.

CODE OF CONDUCT

CABS fully expects all attending delegates to conduct themselves in a safe and appropriate manner throughout the duration of the conference. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:

PROGRAMMING

CABS Roundtable 2016 features the CABS Executive Development Curriculum, a combination of targeted sessions and moderated discussions. An evolution from earlier programming models, the program is intended to give member executives the most value possible out of each event.

For CABS' flagship conference, the programming features specific incoming and outgoing content, with the primary focus for incoming executives being general executive competency development, while the outgoing executives start planning their next steps as they prepare to leave their positions. These objectives are achieved with a combination of lecture-based instructionals and discussion based workshops, in both executive specific groups and Business Student Association groupings.



DEVELOPING SESSIONS | RESEARCH AND ANALYTICS

Using a combination of data mining and research methods, CABS has slotted executives and Business Student Associations into respective sessions based on similar attributes, objectives, and perceived weaknesses. The classifications transcend position titles and instead focus on the core functions and responsibilities of each executive.

The Bank & Baron is a unique urban bar reclaimed within The Bank of Nova Scotia building, which is recognized among one of Alberta's most historical. The Bank of Nova Scotia is located in the heart of Calgary's infamous Stephen Avenue, the pulse of downtown. This avenue was named after George Stephen, 1st Baron Mount Stephen. He was the financial genius behind the creation of the Canadian Pacific Railway, the President of the Bank of Montreal and is remembered as one of the greatest philanthropists of his time.

Ensure to bring \$19 in cash. This cost will cover a burger, beer, gratuity and tax. This amount must be presented to Stefanie Zarnowski, Director Events and Chelan Darough, Director Logistics before entering Bank and Baron. Note that no change will be provided.

Rep Your Track After Party: Knoxville's Tavern Friday, February 26, 2016



Calgary Transit

The downtown portion of the C-Train which travels along 7 Avenue is known as the free fare zone. It is free to ride either C-Train route between 3rd Street East and 11th Street West along 7 Avenue, but a fare must be purchased if traveling outside of the downtown area.

If delegates wish to return from Cowboys on February 25th using the C-Train they can depart from Victoria Park Station heading towards downtown. The fare they must pay is **\$3.15** and **the last train departs at 1:43AM**.

With the close proximity of Standard (700m) and Knoxville's (1.3km) to The Westin, delegates also have the option of walking back. If this option is chosen we advise to walk in groups.
